THE HOPE project (Traditional HEalers working with primary care and mental Health for early interventiOn in Psychosis in young pErsons) is collaborative initiative of Keele University UK, Khyber Medical University Peshawar and Lady Reading Hospital Peshawar (Pakistan), funded by Medical Research Council (MRC UK), which aims to develop culturally appropriate interventions to involve traditional and spiritual healers (TSH) to work together with primary care practitioners (PCPs) and psychiatrists through task shifting for early detection, referral, and treatment of First Episode of Psychosis (FEP). TRIAL MONITORING VISITS:

The Hope internal monitors, Dr. Jalil Khan(PI) and Project Coordinator, Dr. Shumaila Hamid, visited the trial sites weekly to ensure the trial process was going smoothly and encouraged the team to continue working with zeal. Continuous feedback was taken from the trial teams to improve the trial process. KMU CTU team checked the trial data. Uzair Shah and Taha Ayub scanned the trial data files









TRIAL EXTERNAL MONITORS TRAINING:

Trial External Monitors, Dr. Naveed Afzal and Dr. Yousaf Jamal were given mandatory training in monitoring. The training covered the brief intro of THEHOPE Trial, trial progress and overview of monitoring, followed by the hands-on ISF and Patient file checklists

Dr. Abdul Jalil Khan (PI) and Dr. Shumaila Hamid facilitated the session.

EXTERNAL MONITORS VISIT TO TRIAL SITE:

Trial External Monitors, Dr. Naveed Afzal and Dr. Yousaf Jamal visited Lady Reading Hospital and Hayatabad Medical Complex for monitoring visit. Investigator site files, CRFs, patient files and ICFs were thoroughly checked according to the checklist provided. The trial team shared the total number of screened, recruited and trial data entry updates





DATA SAFETY AND MONITORING BOARD MEMBERS (DSMB): FIRST MEETING:

The Hope first meeting on trial data safety and monitoring was held in KMU on 2nd Nov, 2023. Principal Lead Dr. Abdul Jalil Khan and Chief Investigator, Prof. Dr. Saeed Farooq hosted the session. Meeting was chaired by Prof Dr. Javed Iqbal Farooqi. Esteemed members were briefed about the project's aim and the progress in detail.




COMMUNITY & PPIE ADVISORY GROUP MEETING:

Meeting was held at KMU on 22nd Nov, 2023. The group was briefed by Project Manager, Ishfaq Tariq about the overview of the community mental health awareness plan. Members thoroughly reviewed the content and added valuable suggestions and feedback.



THEHOPE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES:

A total of fifteen (15) sessions were conducted in the month of October, November and December, 2023. The sessions were conducted by field research team under the supervision of the Principal lead and Chief Investigator.











Project Manager Ishfaq Tariq and Research Assistants, Uzair Shah and Taha Ayub conducted these sessions under the keen supervision of PI, Dr. Abdul Jalil Khan (PI) and Prof Dr. Saeed Farooq (CI).

The community engagement activities under the HOPE research project were conducted with the local community after the initial two PPIE meetings focusing on community mapping. The focus was to actively involve the local community for creating awareness about the project and common mental health disorders particularly psychosis. Addressing the stigma and misconceptions prevailing in the community and improve access to the mental health services.



THE HOPE PPIE Advisory group: Second meeting

PPIE Advisory group second meeting was conducted on 4th April, 2024 at KMU facilitated by Dr. Noor Sanauddin and Dr. Jalil Khan. The PPIE Advisory group actively participated and shared their valuable feedback and suggestions regarding process evaluation qualitative chapter topic guides. The Hope Process Evaluation:

GLOBAL MENTAL HEALTH SYMPOSIUM, NOV, 2023:

CONTROL Project in collaboration with KEELE and KMU, arranged an informative three-day global mental health symposium in Islamabad.

DAY 1: CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP ON "CONDUCT AND MANAGEMENT OF RANDOMIZED CONTROL TRIALS":

Facilitators for the workshop were Prof. Monica Magadi, Dr. Ivonne Solis-Trapala and Dr. Martyn Lewis. The workshop was attended by early-career researchers, mid-career researchers and public health specialists. Entire Hope team attended the workshop.

Prof Monica Magadi, Professor of Epidemiology and Global Health at Keele, gave an overview of observational studies focusing on the study types, bias, confounding variables and causality. Observational studies were explained in detail with examples.



Dr. Ivonne Solis Trapala, Keels' Clinical Trial Unit Director, explained in detail Randomized control trials, highlighting its importance, common types of RCT and reporting guidelines. She also shared interesting history of how RCT emerged.




