
- 1** Campus Library is open 24/7 during semester

Why use the Library?

- ✓ Library resources usually contain **academic** research rather than journalism or general interest information.
- ✓ Many journal articles will have gone through rigorous evaluation (peer review).
- ✓ Using these resources will help to inform both the research you undertake for assignments and your own practice.
